## TOWN OF SHARON ORDINANCE 14

## AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DRINKING OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS OR BEVERAGES OR THE USE OF NARCOTIC DRUGS IN THE TOWN OF SHARON

Whereas, it appears in the best interest of the citizens of the Town of Sharon to establish an ordinance regulating the drinking or consumption of alcoholic liquors or beverages or the use of narcotic drugs within the Town limits of Sharon, SC.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Governing Body of the Town of Sharon in council duly assembled the 21<sup>st</sup> day of March 1996, that the following shall govern the consumption of liquor or alcoholic beverages or the use of narcotic drugs within the Town limits of Sharon, SC.

- 1. All of the provisions and requirements of the general laws of the State of SC relative to alcoholic beverages, beer and wine and liquor and the consumption thereof are hereby adopted and made a part of this Ordinance to the same extent as if set out at length herein, insofar as such provisions can have application within the Town of Sharon and if not otherwise inconsistent with this ordinance. It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any provision of such State law within the Town of Sharon.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to drink of consume any quantity of alcoholic beverages, beer and wine on the public streets or in view of any of the public streets or public places, including places of worship, within the Town limits of the Town of Sharon.
- 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or be under the influence of alcohol, alcoholic beverages, beer or wine, or a narcotic or illegal drug or to use or consume any narcotic or illegal drugs upon any public street, sidewalk, or any public place, including any place of worship within the Town limits of the Town of Sharon.
- 4. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisoned for not more than thirty days.
